


## President's Message

### **Back to School and School Buses**

It's the most wonderful time of the year! And time to refresh on school bus safety rules and know where the school bus stops are located. **Remember to:** 

- Stop for a stopped school bus with its upper red lights flashing and/or stop arm activated, regardless of which direction you are travelling
- Stop at a safe distance to let children get on or off the bus
- Move forward only when the red lights have stopped flashing and stop arm is no longer activated or the bus begins to move

### Neighbourhood Watch - We're All in this Together!

Neighbourhood Watch (NW), a program initiated by SafeCity Mississauga <a href="https://safecitymississauga.on.ca/">https://safecitymississauga.on.ca/</a> is designed to work with the city to promote safety within our communities and report suspicious activities. Since June there have been three incidents reported to NW including two car break-ins and a complaint about a canvasser not respecting private property. ### **Development Updates**

Intensification is at our doorstep and its implications on single family dwelling communities will be profoundly felt over the next decade. Considering Lakeshore East Corridor projects, Elm and Plan Dixie there is a potential of over 15,000 new units around our community.

Here's a snapshot of some developments approved or under review.

#### **Orchard Heights Park - Pedestrian Bridge**

The OHHA survey report is posted on <u>orchardheights.ca</u>. In a nutshell, 74% of OH residents responded to the survey and of those who responded on whether they were in favour or opposed to a pedestrian bridge, the majority were opposed. This report was sent to Councillor Dasko to share with relevant city staff. We will keep you apprised of any updates.
